

A Checklist of Birds of the Gallon Jug Estate

The data for this list was compiled by Bruce W. Miller and Carolyn M. Miller. Birds are the best known taxa within Belize and at Chan Chich Lodge and the Gallon Jug Estate due to the large number of skilled observers that comprise the many birding groups. This list includes the entire Gallon Jug Estate and is not limited solely to the area around Chan Chich Lodge.

We have compiled more than 22 years of bird research throughout Belize that includes dozens of surveys and studies (see the selected bibliography). This list was compiled from our country-wide database of bird records ($\pm 39,000$ records), nearly 20 years of data collected during the Gallon Jug Estate Christmas Bird Counts, trip reports from the multitude of individuals and birding groups who have visited over the past 20 years and published records.

Current molecular systematics studies have resulted in many name changes as well as realignment of some species into family groups other than what has been historically recognized. Consequently, for this list we follow the current official bird names recognized by the American Ornithologists' Union (A.O.U. 1998. The American Ornithologists' Union Check-list of North American Birds) including all update supplements through 2009.

Check-lists are dynamic documents and as such species are added, removed or have had name changes. Several species that have been included on the various lists for Chan Chich over the years have been determined to have been identification errors. In the early days this was due to the lack of sufficient details in the published field guides or national checklists that available at the time. While this list endeavors to be inclusive of all valid records from Chan Chich Lodge and the Gallon Jug Estate, several species from former lists have been removed for lack of supporting evidence and many added. An example of a removal is the Striped-tailed Hummingbird that is a resident of highlands and has only been documented from the Maya Mountains and foothills in southern Belize.

There are several records of rare species that are based on less than 5 records but remain valid and these have been retained. We have also included an estimate of the "likelihood" of seeing a given species based on an evaluation by the Lodge guides and estimates from the 20 years of birding group reports. The categories are: Common, Uncommon, Rare and Less than 5 records (<5). These are for species likely to be seen in suitable habitat and seasonality. Of the 369 species recorded here nearly 30% are migrant species and would be expected to be seen during the appropriate season.

We thank the Lodge guides Gilberto Vasquez, Raul Martinez, Luis Romero, Ruben Blanco Marvin Ramirez, as well as many birding tour leaders, in particular Paul Wood, for their contributions.

We suggest **A Guide to the Birds of Mexico and Northern Central America** (Howell, S. N. G., and S. Webb. 1995) and **Birds of Belize** (Jones, H., and D. Gardner. 2004) as field guides. Those new to birding will find **101 Birds of Belize** (Carolyn M. Miller 2009) helpful.

This selected bibliography does not include more than a dozen technical reports related to bird surveys and research we have completed in Belize.
